Media is offered in a wide range of ways at Treloar College. We offer Media courses for you to develop your interest or to gain qualifications. We have excellent facilities and staff who have the experience to enable you to achieve your potential in this area of interest and study.

Facilities

The recording studio complex contains:

a vast array of analogue and digital equipment for you to:

- make sound recordings to a professional standard
- develop your skills towards various formal qualifications
- five digital video editing suites for those wishing to follow courses that concentrate on filming and camera operation
- a radio station with which you can be involved as an activities option

The photographic studio contains:

- professional standard equipment, adapted where necessary, to enable all individuals to access the subject
- completely wheelchair-accessible darkroom and lighting studio

Our rehabilitation engineers can work with you and your photography tutor to enable you to use the appropriate equipment.

Digital image making is a major part of photography within the department. You will work with:

- high resolution digital cameras
- high quality scanners and printers
- relevant software such as Adobe Photoshop
