Facilities

The College has professional standard resources and technical equipment to support your photographic studies:

- a good variety of photographic equipment, adapted where necessary, to enable all individuals to access the subject
- completely wheelchair-accessible darkroom
- wheelchair-accessible lighting studio equipped to professional standards

Rehabilitation engineers can work with you and your photography tutor to enable you to use the correct equipment

In the classroom

You will be encouraged to develop practical skills in:

- black and white photography
- colour photography
- creative darkroom techniques
- experimental chemical and digital techniques

You will:

- be introduced to a wide variety of photographic techniques and approaches and have the opportunity to develop your own work from set projects
- undertake research for historical and contextual studies
- learn to develop critical skills in group discussions and one to one tutorials

You will have the opportunity to learn to:

- develop your understanding and skills for creative thought and action
- become more visually aware
- present your ideas in attractive and creative ways

You will gain experience in digital image making using:

- high resolution digital cameras
- high quality scanners and printers
- relevant software such as Adobe Photoshop

Outside the classroom

You might participate in:

- visits to photographic locations
- practical workshops and tutorials
- exhibitions of your work
- after hours photography club
- visits to galleries, museums and exhibitions

There may also be opportunities for related work experience
