# Update: Outdoor Learning Centre, Phase 1 Completed!

We're delighted to announce that despite some pandemic-related delays, the works on the sensory garden and the greenhouse refurbishment for our wonderful new Outdoor Learning Centre have been completed.



Part of the greenhouse is now home to a small animal run and petting area, allowing our students to learn about animal care.

Work on the accessible toilet has also finished. so students will now have appropriate toileting and changing facilities, allowing them to enjoy even more visiting time in the Centre.

The greenhouse has also been made accessible thanks to special sensoroperated electric doors (and can also be opened using a push button). This will allow our students to access the greenhouse without support and become more independent.

  - voices you know, they laugh, cry and
  - feel pain just like you do. But the most important thing they do.
  - is that they live their lives to the fullest.
  - So limplore you to please see through
  - the wheelchair.
  - And take care of the boy inside.

# 'Blown Away' by Angela's Amazing Transatlantic Adventure

Crossing the finishing line at 06:38 on Friday 11th December, Angela, Natasha and the crew completed their 3000 mile journey across the Atlantic.



Shiver me timbers! Treloar's Alumni **Coordinator Angela Cross spent the last** two months of 2020 experiencing the sailing adventure of a lifetime, the 2020 Atlantic **Rally for Cruisers.** 

Whilst on board she worked with disabled sailor / adventurer Natasha Lambert and her family, on board 'Blown Away' their appropriately-named 46ft (14m) catamaran. Angela, Natasha and the crew completed their 3,000 mile journey across the Atlantic

after crossing the finishing line at 06:38 GMT on Friday 11th December 2020, sailing from Las Palmas in Gran Canaria to Rodney Bay, Saint Lucia, in an impressive 18 days, 21 hours and 57 minutes, a fantastic achievement, and our hearty congratulations to everyone on board 'Blown Away'.

Natasha has Quadriplegic Athetoid Cerebral Palsy, so in order for her to sail 'Blown Away' her father has adapted it using cutting-edge 'Sip and Puff' technology which allows her to control the vessel. One thing's for sure: Natasha's spirit for adventure is a real inspiration to all of us here at Treloar's.

Natasha had mixed emotions about reaching Saint Lucia, with her excitement at finishing the gruelling event tinged with sadness due of the end of her epic voyage. I think she would have happily sailed on to join the WORLD ARC – A 26,000 Nautical Mile tradewind circumnavigation starting from Saint Lucia and Australia... but that's another story!

### Stop Press: Treloar's Appoints New Patrons

We're thrilled to announce that both Martin Sinclair and Alderman Sir Andrew Parmley have agreed to become Patrons of the charity.



Martin, a former Learning Support Assistant at Treloar's, is an English footballer who played for England cerebral palsy (CP) team and is currently working in retail for SKY.

He was SaintsAbility development officer for the Saints Foundation at our local Premier League football side Southampton FC. His catchphrase is, "It's about showcasing players ability, rather than

disability." He is the brother of Preston North End (and former Swansea City, Aston Villa and Celtic) footballer Scott Sinclair.

Martin was born with cerebral palsy, but still had ambitions of playing football. As a teenager he fell off a slide resulting in the ball and socket coming out of his hip. The injury was initially diagnosed as a damaged ligament but, when he went to hospital for an operation on his hand an x-ray revealed the real injury. He was confined to a wheelchair for three years and had a hip replacement at the age of 21.

Martin was part of the GB teams that won a bronze medal at the 2010 Paralympic World Cup and a silver medal at the 2012 event. In 2012 he was selected to represent Great Britain at the 2012 Summer Paralympics as part of a twelve-player squad for the 7-a-side football event. Martin and Scott became the first brothers to represent Great Britain at a Paralympic and Olympic Games in the same year.

Alderman Sir Andrew Parmley served as the 689th Lord Mayor of the City of London in 2016-17. Sir Andrew has been



an elected Member of Common Council since 1992 and was elected Alderman of Vintry Ward in 2001.

He has served on many of the City of London Corporation's committees, including as Chairman of The City of London School for Girls and The Guildhall School of Music and Drama, as well as being Governor of The Honourable the Irish Society. He is involved in education and music and is a keen member of more than twenty City Livery companies, including his 'mother company', The Worshipful Company of Musicians.

Everyone at Treloar's are very much looking forward to working with Sir Andrew and Martin in the future.

#### MBE for Treloar Trust's Bruce Powell

Former Treloar Trust Chairman, Bruce Powell, has been awarded the MBE for services to Education in the New Year's Honours list.

Bruce has a long family association with Treloar's and was a key figure in steering the School and College through a significant period of change. He served as Chair of Trustees from 2002-2015 and is currently a Patron of the Treloar Trust.

One of his many achievements during his tenure was the Vision Treloar's appeal, launched to build a new campus which enabled the co-location of the Trust, School and College on a single site in Holybourne. Building work on the

new campus was completed in 2011. During his tenure he also oversaw major construction and refurbishment projects which enhanced the Treloar College facilities, including Brewer House, a new hall of residence and a student social club the 'Chill Out Zone' which was officially opened by The Princess Royal GCVO in 2009.

When Bruce retired in 2015, his legacy was to leave Treloar's with modern, well-equipped facilities and a vibrant School and College campus.

"We are delighted that Bruce's work has been recognised. His leadership and vision were instrumental in makina Treloar's the outstanding provider it is today."
