Hello everyone,

As I approach retirement in June, I am delighted to share with you highlights of my 20 years at Treloar's, and the fantastic changes that donors and friends like you, have supported during that time.



Firstly, our wonderful centenary year in 2008 saw the start of "Vision" Treloar's fundraising campaign to co-locate the School and College at Holybourne.

Brewer and Wessex House were built in 2008 and 2012 respectively, we finally got rid of the 'shack' (student common room) and opened the "Chillout Zone". Another massive event in 2012 was our relocation to Holybourne, ending 60 years in Froyle and marking an exciting new start for us.

Treloar's has to meet the challenges of changing times, regulations, and the complexity of disability. Evans and Gauvain House have been significantly updated, allowing our young people to live in accommodation preparing them for the world beyond Treloar's.

Since 2021 Florence Treloar Hall has been made more accessible, and in September 2021 we opened our fantastic Outdoor Learning Centre, giving students even more opportunities. As I write I can hear building noise as the new key worker staff accommodation development is constructed, ready for occupation around October 2022.

These are just a few highlights, as so much happens every day!

I hope you enjoy reading about our students and news here at Treloar's. Thank you for all your help.

It's not every day you perform for royalty – but Treloar's School students did exactly that as they welcomed our Royal Patron, Her Royal Highness The Countess of Wessex, to campus to open our refurbished performance hall. The hall had become untenable for the complex needs of our students. However, with kind support including the Constable Education Trust who generously donated £100,000, we transformed the hall.

The refurbishment includes new accessible stage ramps, automatically controlled doors, a cooling system to support students unable to regulate their body temperature, a sound system which will particularly benefit students who use communication devices, and aesthetic improvements to the hall.

Her Royal Highness officially opened the hall, cut the ceremonial ribbon and joined in a bell-ringing performance.

7 year-old Zoe performed Abide With Me to mark Remembrance Day. Despite a few nerves, she gave a wonderful performance and there wasn't a dry eye in the house! Led by Treloar's Director of Music Jocelyn Watkins, Zoe's classmates accompanied her with switch operated bells, so everyone

TreloarPrint turns 20!

Set up in September 2001 thanks to generous funding from the Ian Karten Charitable Trust, TreloarPrint provides a working environment for students, and now delivers 2,000 jobs per year employing former students and supporting others into outside work.





TreloarPrint provides printed products, including business cards, letterheads, compliment slips, booklets, manuals, newsletters, flyers and posters, calendars, menus, greeting cards, postcards, invitations, leaflets, envelopes and labels, invitations, mail shots and design artwork.

During their time at TreloarPrint, students develop literacy, ICT, numeracy, and practical, social and other transferable work skills, preparing them for future life and building their confidence and self-esteem.

Aaron Dyer, former TreloarPrint work experience student, went on to gain employment locally. His career has blossomed and he's back working at Treloar's, in the TreloarPrint team.

He said: "As a former student it's wonderful to see TreloarPrint still thriving 20 years

later and providing a wide range of services to the local community.

The 'real world' work experience I gained, as part of the initial group of students to access the equipment provided by the Ian Karten Network, prepared me for the working world after leaving Treloar College in 2003.

I would not have been able to return to work at Treloar's as an Office Administrator and now part of the TreloarPrint team if the IKC hadn't been introduced in 2001."

We can't wait to see what the next 20 years brings, and how TreloarPrint can help our young people make the transition into paid employment and independent lives beyond Treloar's.

Martin said he looked forward to 'being a role model for future generations' and taking part in events 'that showcase each student's ability rather than their disability'.



New rainbow shelter in Primary Playground

A huge thank-you to Sun Life Financial of Canada for donating a bright rainbow shelter for our Primary playground. This means our Primary students can spend even more time outdoors as part of their outdoor enrichment activities.

Our students have been enjoying Halloween and Christmas parties, their weekly cheerleading club and learning how to cook, all under the rainbow shelter protected from the elements! The shelter can be used all year round so students can enjoy the great outdoors even when it is raining or very hot.

2022 Appeal - Creating a fully accessible swimming pool

The increasing complexity of their needs means the number of students who can use our onsite pool for swimming and hydrotherapy is dramatically reduced, as it's difficult to get them in and out of it.



Our plan to renovate the pool would increase capacity by 60% through:

- · Adding five new changing rooms with direct tracked hoists to the pool
- Reducing the depth of the pool, so students can be supported in the water by carers
- Improving ventilation to reduce fatigue
- Re-tiling the pool to help the students' visual needs

These changes would provide significant physiological and mental health benefits to students, and other disability charities who use our facilities during holidays.

We urgently need to update the pool at Treloar's so it can remain open...

"Swimming is a fantastic opportunity for many of our wheelchair bound students to experience a physical freedom different from their day-to-day lives. Many students enjoy a level of independent movement they cannot achieve outside of the water, which promotes their confidence and self-belief. Time spent in the water has a long lasting impact on our students' quality of life." Ellie. PE Teacher at Treloar's.
